

extend. metaphor for a woman - particular type) Sea Rose H.D. (1957) (ext.)

Rose, harsh rose, marred and with stint of petals, meagre flower, thin, sparse of leaf,

more precious than a wet rose single on a stem → pristine healthy, garden Enj. rose (long stem)

switch to 2nd pov. you are caught in the drift. — hardened by sea can't grow fully

Stunted, with small leaf, you are flung on the sand, you are lifted harsh in the crisp sand that drives in the wind. carried away

3rd pov. Can the spice-rose → pale pink-teatime typical rose pressed drip such acid fragrance + dried match hardened in a leaf? the allure of sea rose's bitter, pungent (sea) scent?
